1. INTRODUCTION

The students are more receptive and more responsive in language classes of commerce or management as compared to the class of literature. The response of the student inspires the teacher to go beyond the horizons of experimenting new methods, innovative practices in the classroom. The use of projectors, power point presentations keeps the students in suspense and engages them to ponder. This inspires them to interact and ask more questions when they themselves see on screen and contemplate on what is shown and presented. Through the use of pictures of English writers, movies, on screen plays, they understand the concepts clearly and that retains in their memory for long term.

Information and Communication Technology (ICT) provides tools to improve the students' ability to learn through techniques such as simulation and visualization in science as well as text analysis in literature. ICT provides software and applications that encourage reflection in language learning e.g. applications of quiz on English literature in mobile phones make them learn faster. Nowadays students are growing up in an advanced world that is technologically far changed from the world of their own parents. Now the focus has been shifted to the practical use of education so that students can get jobs in future and this can be possible when they are connected with technology. By selecting one of these web links any information can be accessed. There are famous search engines such as Google and Yahoo to help language students in finding useful information.

2. TEACHING ENGLISH LITERATURE THROUGH ICT TOOLS POETRY

Poetry is the subject the students are least interested in. when it is taught in traditional way like recitation method, translation method, or lecture method, students get bored and their learning ability declines. The students need motivation to learn poetry. ICT can aid the teacher to rejuvenate a literature class. A power point presentation on poetry can be made and it should be presented on screen, an audio can be played where poetry is recited in background. The teacher herself/himself can also recite the poem beautifully. If a teacher has to teach Keats' "Ode on the Grecian Urn" he/she can display the image of an urn which describes classical painting. This will make poem more interesting. In "Ode on the Grecian Urn" the bold lover can't kiss his beloved but will forever chase her as presented on the urn. If the whole image is presented on screen the students will easily grasp the poem. Similarly in a poem "To Autumn" by Keats as suggested by Manali Jain in her paper, an audio can be played on the particular subject. This will help making an impact on the minds of students. The picture of poets can be presented, or the picture of setting, his/her homeland can be shown and biographical details can be discussed by the teacher side by side. The integral impact of the visual and hearing would make students understand what is being taught. The images, symbols, themes and movements of the poem can be elaborated through different slides.

Fiction

Fiction for few students can be interesting. Reading novels, stories, from texts is not everybody's cup of tea. Those who have limited time or those who can't devote full time to text reading, they read the novels in nutshell and hence are deprived of full information. It depends on a teacher how to imbue interest in text books or novels. A teacher can play VCDs/DVDs/Audio books related to the texts. There are many movies based on novels like movies on *Namesake* by Jhumpa Lahiri, *Beloved* by Toni Morrison, *Jude the Obscure* by Hardy, *Mistress of Spices by* Chitra Banerjee Diwakaruni and many more. The themes, characterization, historical context, narration can be discussed through slide shows and presentations. You tube can be utilized for certain memorable scenes.

Instead of reading the dialogues himself/herself, a teacher can present drama on screen. Power point presentation can be used to display important scenes. Instead of watching a whole play at once we can cut the play into bits and pieces. Staged plays can be shown through ICT tools and the minute intricacies of a play can be discussed. With the use of light, stage setting, sound props, all will come live before the

students and it would have a long lasting impact on them. It will educate the students and will give them pleasure as well. You tube can provide various plays of Shakespeare and other playwrights which can be integrated in the library. If a teacher has to teach Samuel Beckett's Waiting for Godot he/she can show the movie on related topic. It is a play of inaction where absurdity of life is depicted. When students read the text they hardly get the pleasure and get bored in no time. But when it is presented on screen they grasp the dialogues, they watch the setting, they see the characters so it becomes easy for them to learn more effectively. Moreover ICT helps students find research articles, online journals, Google books, essays on related subjects or texts. They just have to click on Google or other search engines.

Criticism

Criticism is difficult subject for literature students. The philosophical and theoretical base of these theories makes it hard to understand the concept. Criticism can be made more interesting by the use of examples from literary texts and through practical uses. The best way to teach criticism is through "applied criticism". The students should be provided web resources. The students can learn the blogs of contemporary writers and can comment on various texts. The writers interact and reply the comments. This interaction often leaves a good impact on the students. The teachers can guide the students in criticism by suggesting suitable sites, journals, online magazine, Google books etc.

3. LITERARY THEORY

This is an area which most students dread. The theories can be shown on screen. The teachers can make the interviews, recorded lectures available for students. This is the technical portion of English literature. Teachers can show documentaries on post-colonialism and post-modernism.

American and other non-European writers

Indian writing in English, African literature, American literature, Canadian literature etc. can be taught through ICT. History of English literature can be shown in arranged form. Video conferencing can be facilitated so that interaction can take place among students, research scholars, and teachers not just within India but across the world. This will keep them upto-date and enhance their knowledge. ICT combined with the traditional methods of teaching can make teaching and learning literature more effective.

ICT is not limited to the use of slides or projectors alone. The development of e-content would help students refer to relevant information on a topic. A portal can be developed solely for literature. Even e-books, can be uploaded, links to important journals, articles can be provided.

Students can play quiz, games, learn new words everyday just in seconds. It is helpful in developing English language skills like learning, speaking, reading, writing (LSRW) through language labs.
